All education systems include entrepreneurship education in their curricula, commonly using cross-curricular or subject-based approaches

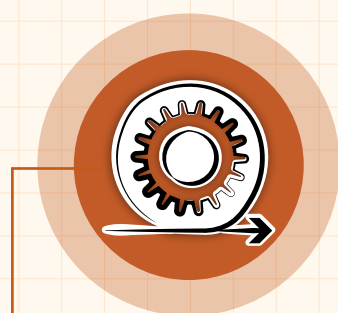

In primary education, entrepreneurship education is mostly taught through non-specialised subjects, while in general upper secondary, it is taught through a wide variety of subjects, including specialised ones

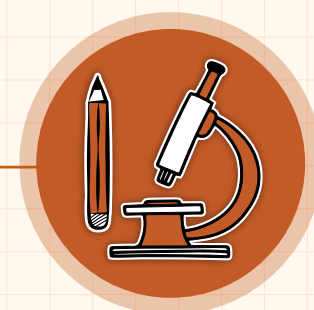
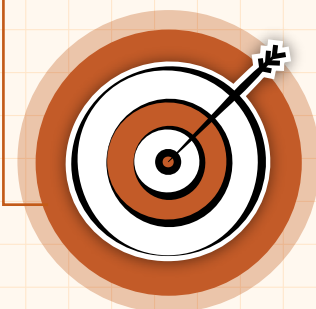


→ **Subjects with

- common in general upper secondary education.



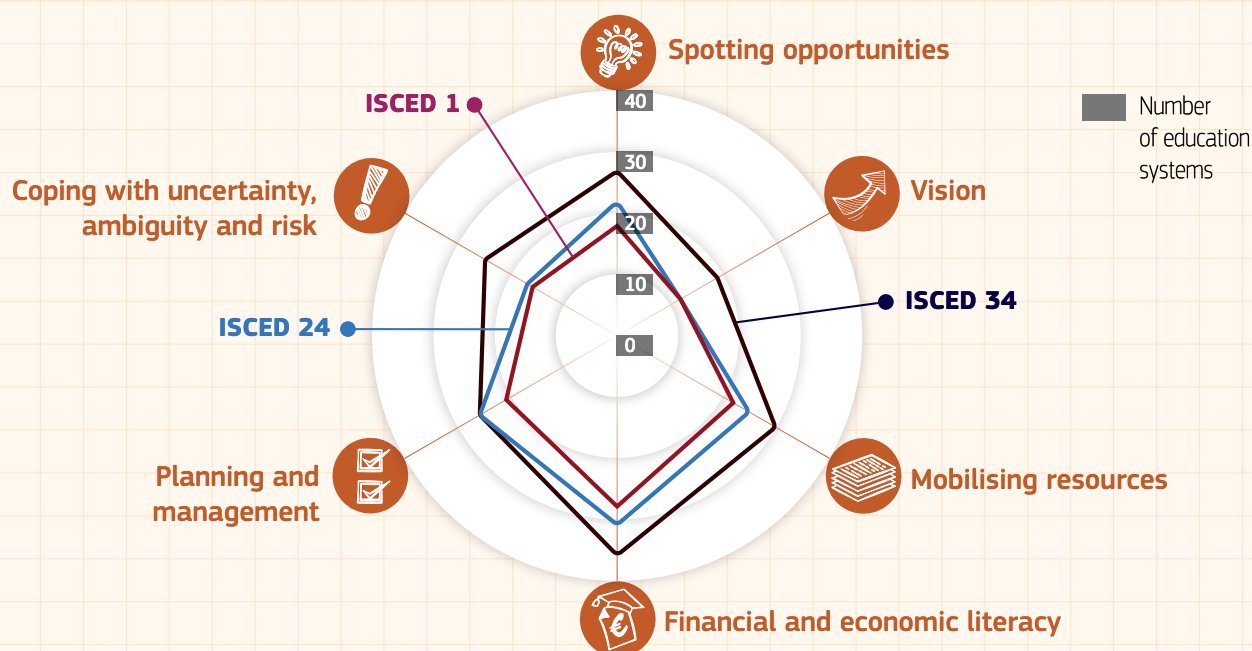
→ **Other subjects

- common in primary and general upper secondary education.

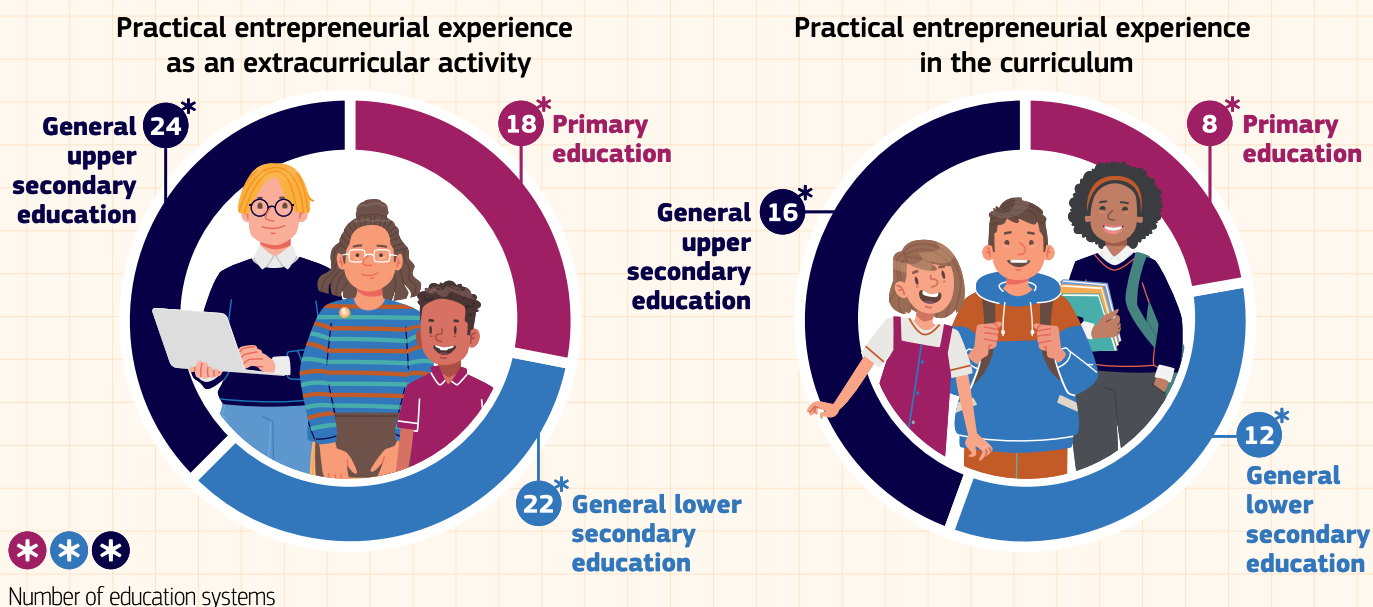

Educational curricula feature a wide-ranging set of entrepreneurship skills, yet the attention given to each component is uneven



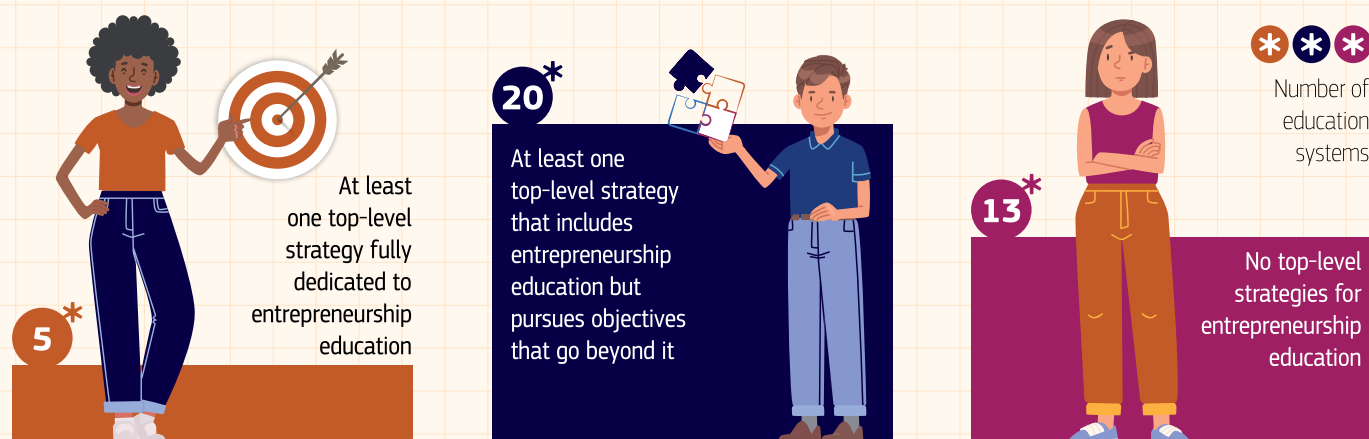
Practical entrepreneurial experiences are mostly offered as extra-curricular activities



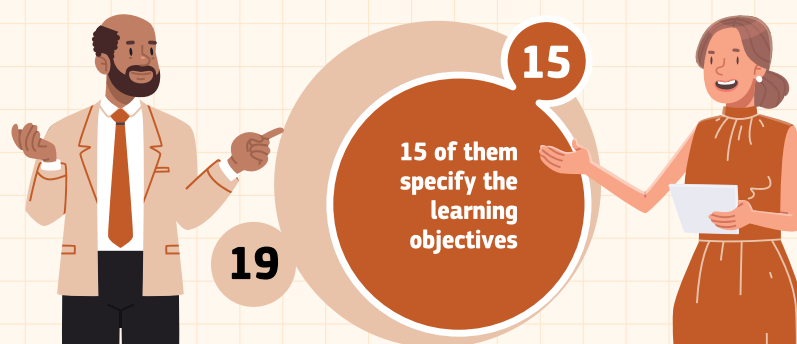
